

Know Your Rights About DACA

- Current DACA recipients keep their deferred action status and work permits until they expire. The administration will no longer accept **new** DACA applications.
- If your DACA permit expires between now and March 5, 2018, you can apply for a two-year renewal. That application must be **received (not just postmarked) by October 5, 2017**.
 - **If you've ever been arrested or have had any contact with the criminal justice system, consult an immigration lawyer to decide whether applying for renewal makes sense.**
- DACA recipients can no longer apply for permission to travel outside the U.S. ("advance parole"). When people who already have advance parole return from abroad, it may be up to border officials' discretion whether to let them in.
 - **If you have an unexpired advance parole grant, consult an immigration lawyer before deciding whether to travel abroad.**
 - **Come home before your advance parole expires—afterwards, you cannot enter the country.**
