Subject: **U.S. 89 Walk**

Dear Ms. Plane:


This letter is to confirm my telephone conversation to you of last Friday, 22 September, in which I agreed that your client would not need a permit to walk down U.S. 89. Obviously, Mr. Thompson should obey all traffic rules and regulations as spelled out in Title 41, Chapter 6a, Part 10, Utah Code Annotated, and in local ordinances. I also would advise Mr. Thompson to be aware that there may be some construction projects along the U.S. 89 corridor. One project is located at approximately North Temple and State Street in Salt Lake County; two other projects are on State Street and around 7800 South and between 90<sup>th</sup> and 106<sup>th</sup> South in Salt Lake County.

These projects may close the adjacent sidewalks temporarily and Mr. Thompson will need to avoid this area. I suggest that your client also monitor the department's website for ongoing construction since there are also other projects along the U.S. 89 Corridor where work is being done that may require your client to vary his route.
